Welcome to Lord of Life!

All are welcome here. We extend a special welcome to visitors. We're glad you joined us today! The following information may help you in your worship experience and getting to know Lord of Life.

Communal words spoken and sung will be on the screen and/or in this bulletin. The bold text is spoken together. Songs/hymns can also be found (with music) in either Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW) cranberry hymnal or All Creation Sings (ACS) purple hymnal. Both can be found under a chair near you.

Holy Communion is the Lord's Table and all are welcome, regardless of age. We celebrate the Eucharist (literally "thanksgiving") during worship every Sunday. Our bread is dairy, nut, and gluten-free; wine and juice are both available.

Children are welcome in this place! At baptism, we welcome people into God's family and the community of Lord of Life. Children of all ages are integral members of the Body of Christ, and have a place in our community that includes worship. Children learn by seeing, hearing, and experiencing worship with adults who care about them (not just their parents). We embrace the sounds and activity that accompany them. We have a few resources for parents:

PrayGround: Table up front with coloring supplies. Go with your child, sit near the table, or send them independently.

Activity Bags: great things to occupy busy hands during worship, located in the shelves just outside the sanctuary; ask an usher if you need help finding them.

Nursery (for children 0-5, 5-7 by exception): You can leave young children in the nursery. Our nursery attendant has been background checked. There is a sign-in sheet for security.

Narthex (Gathering/Entrance space): Benches, rocking chairs, or space to move around.

Offering is an act of worship and a privilege to return to God a portion of what God has given us. If you are a guest, do not feel obligated to give, but for those comfortable participating, please join us in this act of worship. Offerings given today are joyfully used for outreach to the greater church/community and for the work and ministry of Lord of Life. You may donate by using the QR code that leads you to the website (www.lordoflife.org), by mail, using direct deposit with your bank, or RMD / QCD / or stock gift (in consultation with your financial advisor).

If at anytime you are uncomfortable standing, you are free to remain seated.

If you are worshiping from home, you are invited to participate, not just observe. Please prepare your own sacred space for worship. You might include some candles, a cross, and water for remembering your baptism. Join

worship in-person to celebrate Communion with the congregation! If that is not possible, please reach out and we can have a member of our Care Team arrange a visit with Communion.

Lord of Life is a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). We are located on the ancestral homeland of the Cayuse, Umatilla, Walla Walla, Palouse, Wanapum, and Yakama peoples. We give thanks for their presence and care of this land since time immemorial. 

All Christian worship is biblical. We currently follow the Narrative Lectionary (NL), a relatively new approach to reading scripture, created by professors at Luther Seminary in 2010. The NL seeks to provide a narrative arc through scripture. We start in Genesis in the fall and work through the early stories of God's people, hear from the prophets and reach the gospel by Christmas, where we stay through Easter. After Easter we'll hear some post-resurrection accounts and then stories of the early church through the Acts of the Apostles and the Epistles.

Hearing the proclamation of the Word is central to our worship experience. The Word is proclaimed throughout our worship, in our liturgy, prayers, sermon, hymns, and yes, scripture. You are invited to let go of the need to read along and simply listen. and let the Spirit lead your imagination and inspire your hearing.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION, ELW Setting 8



READING OF SCRIPTURE: Luke 24:1-11

The holy gospel from Luke, the 24th chapter. Glory to you, O Lord.

But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, [the women] came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. ²They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³but when they went in, they did not find the body. ⁴While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. ⁵The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. ⁶Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, ⁷that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." ⁸Then they remembered his words, ⁹and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. ⁹Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. ⁹But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them.

AFFIRMATION OF **F**AITH

The creeds are a response to and a proclamation of the word. In our liturgy, sometimes we will use the creeds within church doctrine, and sometimes we use affirmations of faith, like this one, that use modern language to articulate our beliefs. Sometimes new words open up new pathways for naming and claiming what we believe. This affirmation is adapted and used with permission from Pilgrim Uniting Church in Australia.

Let us affirm our faith in God together.

We believe in God, who creates us, who sustains us, who is our life and our breath.

We follow Jesus Christ, who showed us God.
He received and shared God's grace.
He trusted God in everything.
He let go of life, so all would come to know God's Love.
He gave his life, so all might be healed.
And though he was crucified, God gave him life again.
He rose, and is still among us in a new way.

Through the gift of the Holy Spirit,
We now live as the Body of Christ in the world.
We rejoice in the gift of forgiveness, the reality of resurrection,
And the mystery of eternal life.
By the power of the Holy Spirit, and in the name of Christ,
we devote ourselves to give generously of all we receive,
for the sake of the healing of the world,
and the eternal glory of God.

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

This time of prayer reflects the wideness of God's mercy for the whole world. You are invited to bring voice to these petitions as they call upon your heart.

Assisting Minister: Alleluia! On this day of resurrection joy, let us offer our prayers for ourselves, our neighbors, and all of creation.

Reader: Alleluia! God, you are resurrection. Bring joy to your church as we spread the good news that Jesus is risen. Lead us to proclaim this message with persistence and confidence.

Merciful God, receive our prayer.

Alleluia! God, you are creator. Open our eyes to the first fruits of new life around us; to budding trees, nourishing rains, warm breezes, and freshly tilled soil. Inspire our gratitude and renew our commitment to stewardship of the earth. Merciful God, **receive our prayer.**

Alleluia! God, you are reconciliation. As you raised Jesus from the dead, bring new hope for peace and reconciliation in places of war and strife, especially in Palestine and Israel, Ukraine and Russia, and South Sudan and Sudan. Raise up leaders who are steadfast in their commitment to justice and transformation. Merciful God, receive our prayer.

Alleluia! God, you are strength. Awaken hope and perseverance in all who need to hear your words of life this day; those who are hungry, anxious, sick, oppressed, or despairing. Merciful God, receive our prayer.

Alleluia! God, you are life. We give you thanks as we remember our baptisms today. By water and your word, we are forever joined to Christ's death and resurrection. Embolden all who share this baptized life and renew us in faith and in action. Merciful God, receive our prayer.

Alleluia! God, you are comfort. Draw near to all who grieve. Refresh us with the promise that you will destroy death and that, with all the saints, we will be made alive forever in Christ. Merciful God, receive our prayer.

Assisting Minister: We commend these and all our prayers to you, O God. Come near to us with your saving help, for the sake of Jesus Christ, our risen Savior and Lord. Amen.

PEACE

The peace of Christ be with you always. And also with you.

As we share the peace with each other, remember that we all have different comfort levels of touch. You might use hand signals, a wave, a bow, a smile, a fist bump, or a handshake. We proclaim the peace of the risen Christ, not simply a greeting.

We praise you, God of freedom, for you breathed life into the void and showed yourself as the one who loves in freedom.



For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.


COMMUNION
