## Welcome to Lord of Life!

All are welcome here. We extend a special welcome to visitors. We're glad you joined us today! The following information may help you in your worship experience and getting to know Lord of Life.

**Communal words** spoken and sung will be on the screen and/or in this bulletin. The bold text is spoken together. Songs/hymns can also be found (with music) in either Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW) cranberry hymnal or All Creation Sings (ACS) purple hymnal. Both can be found under a chair near you.

**Holy Communion** is the Lord's Table and all are welcome, regardless of age. We celebrate the Eucharist (literally "thanksgiving") during worship every Sunday. Our bread is dairy, nut, and gluten-free; wine and juice are both available.

Children are welcome in this place! At baptism, we welcome people into God's family and the community of Lord of Life. Children of all ages are integral members of the Body of Christ, and have a place in our community that includes worship. Children learn by seeing, hearing, and experiencing worship with adults who care about them (not just their parents). We embrace the sounds and activity that accompany them. We have a few resources for parents:

PrayGround: Table up front with coloring supplies. Go with your child, sit near the table, or send them independently.

Activity Bags: great things to occupy busy hands during worship, located in the shelves just outside the sanctuary; ask an usher if you need help finding them.

Nursery (for children o-5, 5-7 by exception): You can leave young children in the nursery. Our nursery attendant has been background checked. There is a sign-in sheet for security.

Narthex (Gathering/Entrance space): Benches, rocking chairs, or space to move around.

Offering is an act of worship and a privilege to return to God a portion of what God has given us. If you are a guest, do not feel obligated to give, but for those comfortable participating, please join us in this act of worship. Offerings given today are joyfully used for outreach to the greater church/community and for the work and ministry of Lord of Life. You may donate by using the QR code that leads you to the website (www.lordoflife.org), by mail, using direct deposit with your bank, or RMD / QCD / or stock gift (in consultation with your financial advisor).

If at anytime you are uncomfortable standing, you are free to remain seated.

If you are worshiping from home, you are invited to participate, not just observe. Please prepare your own sacred space for worship. You might include some candles, a cross, and water for remembering your baptism. Join worship in-person to celebrate Communion with the congregation! If that is not possible, please reach out and we can have a member of our Care Team arrange a visit with Communion.

#### THANKSGIVING FOR BAPTISM

We give thanks for the gift of water that sustains us and, in the gift of baptism, connects us to Christ in death and resurrection.

#### GATHERING HYMN: ELW #401 Gracious Spirit, Heed Our Pleading

Wison Niwagila composed this song in 1965 after the Evangelical Lutheran Churches in Tanzania became untied to form one Lutheran Church. He has served in many capacities as a pastor and a leader in higher education in Tanzania and Germany. He currently serves as Provost for Josiah Kibira University College in the North Western Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania. Our Companion Synod is the Ulanga-Kilombero Diocese of the ELCT, in the southern part of Tanzania.

All Christian worship is biblical. We follow the Narrative Lectionary (NL), which seeks to provide a narrative arc through scripture and increase biblical literacy. Instead of a 3-year cycle like the RCL (Revised Common Lectionary, where Matthew, Mark, and Luke each get their own year, and John interspersed throughout), the NL is a 4-year cycle where every gospel gets its own year. The NL starts in Genesis and works through the early stories of God's people, hears from the prophets and reaches the gospel by Christmas, where it stays through Easter. After Easter we'll hear some post-resurrection accounts and stories of the early church through the Acts of the Apostles and the Epistles.

Hearing the proclamation of the Word is central to our worship experience. The Word is proclaimed throughout our worship, in our liturgy, prayers, sermon, hymns, and yes, scripture. You are invited to let go of the need to read along and simply listen, and let the Spirit lead your imagination and inspire your hearing.

#### INTRODUCTION TO THE READING

#### SCRIPTURE ACCLAMATION: ELW #519 Open Your Ears, O Faithful People

This is a traditional Hasidic tune. The Hasidic movement comes from Eastern Europe. It emphasizes the study of Torah, a continual awareness of God's presence, joyful and ecstatic exuberance, and physical involvement of the whole body at worship. The author of the text, Willard F. Jabusch, a priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago, heard the tune when he was in Israel and put words to it.

#### READING OF SCRIPTURE: Acts 2:1-4 & Galatians 4:1-7; 5:13-26

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles:

<sup>1</sup>When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. <sup>2</sup>And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup>Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. <sup>4</sup>All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

#### A reading from Paul's letter to the Galatians:

I'm saying that as long as the heirs are minors, they are no different from slaves, though they really are the owners of everything. However, they are placed under trustees and guardians until the date set by the parents. In the same way, when we were minors, we were also enslaved by this world's system. But when the fulfillment of the time came, God sent his Son, born through a woman, and born under the Law. This was so he could redeem those under the Law so that we could be adopted. Because you are sons and daughters, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, Abba, Father! Therefore, you are no longer a slave but a son or daughter, and if you are his child, then you are also an heir through God.

<sup>13</sup>You were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only don't let this freedom be an opportunity to indulge your selfish impulses, but serve each other through love. <sup>14</sup> All the Law has been fulfilled in a single statement: *Love your neighbor as yourself*. <sup>15</sup> But if you bite and devour each other, be careful that you don't get eaten up by each other!

<sup>16</sup>I say be guided by the Spirit and you won't carry out your selfish desires. <sup>17</sup>A person's selfish desires are set against the Spirit, and the Spirit is set against one's selfish desires. They are opposed to each other, so you shouldn't do whatever you want to do. <sup>18</sup> But if you are being led by the Spirit, you aren't under the Law. <sup>19</sup> The actions that are produced by selfish motives are obvious, since they include sexual immorality, moral corruption, doing whatever feels good, <sup>20</sup> idolatry, drug use and casting spells, hate, fighting, obsession, losing

your temper, competitive opposition, conflict, selfishness, group rivalry,

<sup>21</sup>jealousy, drunkenness, partying, and other things like that. I warn you as I have already warned you, that those who do these kinds of things won't inherit God's kingdom.

<sup>22</sup> But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, <sup>23</sup> gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against things like this. <sup>24</sup> Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the self with its passions and its desires.

<sup>25</sup> If we live by the Spirit, let's follow the Spirit. <sup>26</sup> Let's not become arrogant, make each other angry, or be jealous of each other.

Hear what the Spirit is saying to the church. **Thanks be to God.**

#### Communion

All are welcome at the Lord's table, as we receive the presence of Christ for us in bread and wine. This meal is for all regardless of age, race, gender, sexual orientation, criminal record, or list of offenses.

Make your way to the front using the side aisle. There will be bread, wine, and grape juice. A basket to collect used cups is in the center. After receiving the elements, return to your seat by the center aisle. If you have questions when you get up front, it is okay to ask. The bread is gluten-free, nut-free, dairy-free, and full of grace!

The Meal may be brought to your seat if it would be helpful; please let the ushers know and they will notify the leaders.

#### **HYMNS DURING COMMUNION**

ELW #523 Let Us Go Now to the Banquet (Vamos Todos al Banquete)

Guillermo Cuéllar (b. 1955) wrote this text and tune, inspired from his mass (liturgy) Misa popular salvadoreña. He is from El Salvador. The mass welcomes all "the poor and hungry to the banquet of justice and good." He composed it in the late 1970s when he was working closely with Archbishop Oscar Romero, who commissioned it but was assassinated before it was finished. Because Cuéllar wrote it, he received death threats that forced him to live in Nicaragua for ten years. The authorities were especially unhappy with him for the part about sharing everything—which is stronger in Spanish. Though he based what he wrote on Acts 4:32-35, he was accused of being a Communist. This hymn is known from memory by many in El Salvador and throughout Latin America. It was included in the movie Romero.

#### Spirit of the Living God

Daniel Iverson (b. Brunswick, GA, 1890; d. Asheville, NC, 1977) wrote the first stanza and tune of this hymn after hearing a sermon on the Holy Spirit during an evangelism crusade by the George Stephens Evangelistic Team in Orlando, Florida, 1926. The hymn was sung at the crusade and then printed in leaflets for use at other services. Published anonymously in Robert H. Coleman's Revival Songs (1929) with alterations in the tune, this short hymn gained much popularity by the middle of the century. Since the 1960s it has again been properly credited to Iverson. Iverson studied at the University of Georgia, Moody Bible Institute, Columbia Theological Seminary, and the University of South Carolina. Ordained in the Presbyterian Church in 1914, he served congregations in Georgia and in North and South Carolina. In 1927 he founded the Shenandoah Presbyterian Church in Miami, Florida, and served there until his retirement in 1951. An evangelist as well as a preacher, Iverson planted seven new congregations during his ministry in Miami.

#### **SENDING HYMN:** ELW #538 The Lord Now Sends Us Forth (Enviado Soy De Dios)

We sing through the hymn twice, observing the repeats (first section twice, second section twice, repeat). You are invited to sing each section in English the first time, and Spanish the second.

This hymn is no longer "anonymous" as your hymnal suggests. It was discovered in 1982, where it was said it was 'anonymous from Nicaragua or thereabouts.' It was not written down at the time. Pablo Sosa transcribed it around that time, and eventually met Noel Fernandez Callot, a blind Baptist pastor from Cuba who told him that it had been written by a Cuban Pentecostal pastor named Jose Aguiar. This has been confirmed, and Jose Aguiar (as of 2009) is pastor of the Sovereign Grace Church in Cuba and serves as coordinator of the Cuban Council of Churches in La Habana province.

The hymn was translated by Gerhard Cartford in 1998. In Spanish it is in the first person singular; Cartford cast it into the first person plural. It may be that first person plural in our time does for the North American context what the first person singular does or did for the Latin American one—no heroes, just the seemingly impossible task that "falls to you and me," with God's help, to "make all of the earth a better place to live" against all oppressive tyranny, whether hidden or not.
